his week we were very excited that some farm animals came to visit us. We have been learning about different farm animals and where our food comes from. We were able to feed and touch the animals. We gave the goats some leaves from an apple tree which were brought in from their home at Spitalfields City Farm. Many children needed a little encouragement to do this, but soon discovered that there was nothing to be afraid of and that the animals were very gentle. We learnt that we have to use small voices so as not to scare the animals and that when we touch them, we need to use gentle hands. We talked about respect and how these things are important when we are with our friends too. A few other children from other years also came to see the animals and even helped to take the animals and equipment back to the van at the end of the visit.







# What we have done this week

Donaldson

Early Years had a surprise visit from farm animals from Spitalfields City Farm! There were two goats, two miniature donkeys and three chickens! Children had the opportunity to stroke and feed the animals. It was very exciting! Thank you to the PSA for funding the fantastic visit. Everyone really enjoyed the experience.

In preparation, Reception learned about non-fiction this week. We learnt that information can be retrieved from computers and books. In our key groups we learnt facts about pigs, cows, goats and sheep. Every child wrote their non-fiction fact page and completed a guided drawing. We will be making non-fiction class books to enjoy in our

book areas.









Mozart

This week, Hadid class went on a trip to Bruce Castle Museum. We took part in a Victorian School workshop to help us better understand what school was like during this period, we compared this to our very own experience of school today. The children really enjoyed dressing up, role playing a Victorian style lesson and practicing their handwriting using a slate board and a slate pencil.













Seacole Class have worked so hard and made amazing progress this half-term. We decided to celebrate with a trip to the park in the sunshine. Have a wonderful break everyone!











During art, Bolt class explored the meaning of art and how flowers can be used to inspire and create art. Bolt class looked at the colour, texture, patterns, shapes and form of real flowers.







#### Attenborough

This term Attenborough Class have been creating the setting of 'Mufaro's Beautiful Daughters. We have enjoyed creating the beautiful rainforest setting using a range of materials. Here are some of their wonderful creations!









This week in Dahl class the children were learning about capacity and volume. What better way than to pour bright green liquid into various size measuring jugs and beakers. This gave them the perfect chance to see what a millilitre and litre really looked like and to say out loud a variety of measurements, as well as work out what was actually on the scales. Surprisingly, no desks or books were drowned in the process!









This week we have been looking at decimals and place value. Here the children were playing a game with a 10 sided dice where they have to make the largest number they can using a 10 sided dice



Gandhi Class have been using instruments to explore pitch and volume in our science lesson. They used a range of instruments. Both classes had to organise themselves from low to high pitch. They did this very effectively.







#### **Pankhurst**

In science this week we went to the park to conduct an experiment on the hardness of different materials. We had a coin and a wooden stick to scratch different objects and measure how hard or weak it was. We found that the metal of the fence was the hardest material.









Thompson

This week in year 5 we have been looking at sonnets and learning how to write them. Here we are learning how to perform sonnets using iambic pentameter.







Last week, to kickstart our Year 6 science after SATs, we visited The Science Museum. Science is all about inquiry and wonder - so it only seemed fitting that we spend an hour in the The Wonder Lab, where we had hands-on experience with a variety of objects and devices that went - Zap! Pop! And Ping! After lunch, we were dazzled by live experiments in The Wonder Show. Do Proboscidea actually use Elephant's Toothpaste? In the afternoon, the class took their groups on their own child-led exploration around the museum.
