much fun celebrating that we need to respect everyone and different families







This week we have been learning about biographies. We did some research on Harry Kane and found out lots of facts ready to write our biographies on Friday.




This week we have been writing 'Guess Who' riddles about mini beasts. We are so proud of the children's independent writing.

Can you guess who? By Phoebe I have 6 legs. I have black spots. I can fly.




We read the story of And Tango Makes Three and made penguins afterwards. It's one of our books for Pride Awareness week!

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We had their Clarinet and Trumpet concert this week! It was fantastic, hopefully some of them continue with their talents in year 5.





This is a fabulous way for children to continue to build their enthusiasm for reading. With this year's theme of Wild World Heroes, children can also learn more about the environment!



There will be an ice lolly sale and also a Uniform Swap shop where you can bring along your old uniform and pick up the next size. Donate what you can to the PSA.







