We have been having a great time settling into our new school and exploring our classroom.




We have been learning all about the new routines at school and having fun as well!


Mozart

We have been learning about Hanukkah, we spent the afternoon making our very own Hanukkiah which is a special type of menorah used during Hanukkah.




We have been learning about David Attenborough and all the work he has done writing and presenting, in conjunction with the BBC Natural History Unit.



În maths we have been learning about place value to 1000.



This week we made posters about the era in Italy that Fibonacci lived. And looked into the lives of the rich and the poor.






Thompson

Today was one of the most shocking days of my life! I was extremely excited as I went to watch the Epsom Derby this year!

However my excitement was short lived as something tragic happened to a poor lady. So, I will start from the beginning.

As soon as the race started my legs were shaking with excitement to see who would win.

A few minutes after the race had started, I saw a woman next to me. She as looking like she was getting ready to jump out onto the race track. The horses were coming round... she braced herself.

And she jumped. She started waving something in the air shouting "STOP! STOP!" but she was too late. The horse smashed into her. She collided with the ground and a crowd of people crowded round her weak body.

For a second, my heart stopped beating. I dashed though the crowd and spotted a small crumpled object.




Like many festivals, the Edinburgh Book Festival has released many of its author events online. These are a great chance to watch an author with your child, at home!
