Food Bank Collection

As we are getting near to Christmas, our thoughts have turned once again to those less fortunate than ourselves who need a little more support at this time of year. Thus we have decided to do another collection for the Tottenham Food Bank. If you can donate any items please bring them into the school office.

(Typical donation items are as follows: Cereal, Soup, Pasta, Rice, Tinned tomatoes/pasta sauce, Lentils, beans and pulses, Tinned meat, Tinned vegetables, Tea/coffee, Tinned fruit, Biscuits, UHT milk, Fruit juice, toiletries and hygiene products.)

About the foodbank: The foodbank helps individuals and families in crisis through the provision of emergency food supplies. The circumstances surrounding a crisis are unique to every individual, so we partner with frontline care professionals, such as health visitors, social workers and other community-based support workers, who are able to identify and refer people facing hunger to the foodbank. As well as receiving nutritionally-balanced 3 day food parcels, people are welcomed with a cup of tea, listened to and signposted to agencies that are able to help resolve the underlying cause of the problem.

Steve McQueen Year 3 Exhibition

Last year our children took part in the Steve McQueen Year 3 project for the Tate Gallery. He invited every Year 3 pupil in London to have their photograph taken by a team of specially trained Tate photographers. They included children from state primaries, independent schools, faith schools, special schools, pupil referral units and home-educated pupils. These class photos were then brought together into a single large-scale installation, capturing tens of thousands of Year 3 pupils in a milestone year in their development. Our children went to see this amazing exhibition last week.












Maths Week
