This week for reading, we have been learning all about recycling. We looked around our classroom and decided which items we could reduce, reuse and recycle.









Tin Maths we have been using counters to Explore multiplication and division.








Mandela

Covid Precautions

PCR tests should be taken if your child:

shows covid symptoms

has had a positive lateral flow test

has been identified as a close contact of a confirmed case

Lateral flow tests are for asymptomatic testing for both vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals. If your child has symptoms a PCR test should be arranged.

If someone in your household tests positive for Covid arrange for a PCR test.

Anyone with symptoms should self isolate and wait for the results of their PCR test.

Anyone without symptoms at Primary School can continue to attend school but should take a lateral flow test every day for 7 days. If your child becomes symptomatic during this time keep them at home and arrange for a PCR test.
