Have a look at the picture, What do you think is happening? What is the girl doing and why? What book do you think she is reading? Do you think is a fun book? How do you think the girl is feeling? Have you ever felt that way? How do you feel when you read stories? If you think the girl is sad or tired what do you think she could do instead?

-Can you make a dark den at home? Can you make shadows in it? Can you make different shaped shadows?
