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


This week in PSHE Seacole Class have been learning about relationships and who makes us feel safe. We created a class bunting with people who are special to us.

In Thompson class this week , children completed their computing unit on Game




Creator . They created their own computer games which was fun and exciting. They then carried out self and peer evaluation focusing on planned approach, design , game environment and graphic components

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



We have all had a wonderful day celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. There were some fantastic costumes, amazing commemorative plate designs and delicious scones!


