This week in Year 1 we have been reading the story 'Amazing'. The story focuses on people not being defined by their limitations and spoke about everyone being amazing in their own way. In class the children discussed how being visually impaired may be hard to do certain things. In pairs the children had to blindfold one another and guide them through the playground and discuss how the experience made them feel.

cereal, rice, croutons, toothpaste, biscuits, and noodles. They all looked fantastic (if deeply disgusting was what you were looking for).

Fibonacci

This week in Fibonacci class we have been looking at place value. Here are the children using base 10 to show different values of different digits.

















We learnt abou matter in our science lesson. We were very surprised to find out that there are actually more states of matter than just liquid, solids and aases. We discussed how substances can change between different states. In the experiment shown, an effervescent tablet was added to water. As it released gas, the balloon then inflated.

In our first few weeks back at school, Thompson class have been researching the life and interests of Dr Shirley Thompson. We have been listening to her symphonies and learning about what an orchestra is. We made a booklet all about her.



For our first couple of weeks back after the holidays, Pankhurst class have been learning about Emmeline Pankhurst as she is our class namesake. In English, we have produced biographies about her amazing life, and in Art we designed posters as if we were suffragettes in the 1900s.








Malala

Here they're framing as Bess, looking out of her window towards The Highwayman.




