This week, in science, we were looking at how water moved through a plant. To do this celery sticks were put in coloured water (red and blue) and over three days we were able to see how the water was travelling through the celery sticks because they slowly changed colour.





As part of our learning in History about Ancient Egypt and writing an instructional text in English, Attenborough class enjoyed mummifying oranges! We scooped out the inside of the oranges and filled it with salt, bicarbonate soda and cinnamon. Then we wrapped them with bandages. We hope to u nwrap the mummified oranges in a few weeks!

During science, Bolt Class collected data from their peers. The children measured each other's foot length and height.
