
for poetry - intonation, volume, cadence, and characterisation; as well as complementing our narration with drama.

## LOST PROPERTY


We are already accumulating a lost of lost property which can be located in the main school reception. Please make sure you label all your child's items clearly with their name.

Wandering through the graveyard it felt like something was watching me.


