This week we all got started on our very own beanstalks. We talked about what plants need to grow and how we can look after them. We also planted an 'observation bean' in a clear jar so we can see what the bean is doing underground. This week in Mozart Class we have been learning about Arrays. We created our own arrays and wrote a number sentence to match our arrays. We had so much fun!








In an engaging science experiment, children in Attenborough class explored the impact of different surfaces on the movement of objects on them at a certain angle. From carpet to sandpaper, rubber, and laminate wood, they investigated friction and resistance firsthand. They observed how each surface affected the movement of objects, drawing conclusions about the role of texture in altering speed. Based on their observation the young scientists created diagrams and explained their reasoning using scientific terminologies.








The children have waited a long time for this volcanoes unit to start and they are throwing themselves into it with gusto. This week they had the chance to draw the inside of a volcano, to discover exactly what is going on beneath us. They drew these incredible diagrams in their books and learnt all about the difference between magma and lava while doing it.







Last week, year 4 went on our first residential trip to Tolmers. It was a massive success! The children got to scale a climbing wall, practise their hand at archery, build shelters and much, much more. We even got to toast marshmallows around the campfire. We had a lot of fun and I was so impressed with the children's energy and behaviour.





To consolidate our learning in perimeter and area this week we took metre sticks and explored the area and perimeter of different rooms and objects around the school. Naturally, we found that the area of the KS2 hall was the biggest, coming in at 240m²!

The London Schools Sponsored Mini Marathon

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We were inspired by the London Marathon this week and are excited to announce our upcoming involvement in The London Schools Mini Marathon. All of the children in the school will be taking part the week of 6th May. The London Schools Mini Marathon is a city wide event in which our children will run, jog, walk or wheel 2.6 miles around Chestnuts Park (or a shorter distance around the school playground for Reception). Our children will be joining over a million children who have taken part since 2020!

The children are taking part to fundraise for the first phase of vital updates needed for their playground, as it has recently been decommissioned. They are raising money to go towards a new multi-use games area (MUGA).

Please encourage your child to seek sponsors (family, friends, neighbours). Sponsors can pledge any amount as a donation. All proceeds will directly benefit the school playground update, through the Crowdfunder campaign and will go towards our fundraising target of £10,000. If we meet this, Sport England will match this with £10,000 to give us the funds needed to develop the playground.
