
This week we have been doing a lot of creative writing.

We have had a very busy but fantastic Anti-Bullying week. We started off on Monday with a Live virtual Lesson on BBC Teach which was a half-hour interactive programme for primary schools, highlighting some of the issues around bullying.

During the week each class has created a ONE KIND WORD DISPLAY where the children added kind words and phrases to this display as they are introduced and said each day. The children have been encouraged to use words as often as they can throughout the week.
