This week the new Reception children have been settling into new routines and exploring their new classrooms. The children are all doing so well!

This week, the children have been learning about the seasons. As part of their exploration, they went on a walk around Chestnuts Park to observe the trees. They noticed that while some leaves had already fallen, most of the trees were still green. The children also spotted berries and seed pods growing. It was a lovely opportunity to enjoy the fresh air and connect their learning with the natural world.



This week in Maths we have been building on our understanding of numbers to 100, focusing on tens, ones, and the place value of each digit. To start our lessons, we enjoyed a creative activity where we used tens and ones to build different shapes and objects. Once our creations were complete, we worked with partners to quiz each other with questions such

as: How many tens and ones have you used? What is one more? What is one less? This helped us strengthen our number knowledge in a fun and practical way.

As part of our Rights Respecting Schools work, we linked this to Article 28: the right to an education, making sure we are all supported to learn and to challenge ourselves in a respectful and positive way.













Rashford class have been learning about their rights. We have looked at the UNCRC and the class decided on specific rights to focus on. For example Article 12, the right to be heard, Article 29, the right to an education and article 19 the right to be safe.



What an inspiring start to Year 3! This week, our class has been learning all about our inspirational person, Sir David Attenborough. The children have thrown themselves into researching his incredible life and achievements, showing growing resilience and enthusiasm along the way. They have created beautifully presented fact files, sharing fascinating details about his early life and his passion for protecting the planet. Building on their research, the children then worked

hard to write biographies, carefully crafting sentences, editing their work, and taking real pride in their writing.

Alongside this, we have been exploring the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). The class chose Articles that were meaningful to them, explaining why it matters, and added their name to our new Year 3 Class Charter. This has helped us start the year thinking about the importance of respect, kindness, and our responsibilities to one another.

It has been a wonderful beginning to the year; the children have shown curiosity, teamwork and determination and I am excited to see where their learning takes them next!







What a lovely start to our year in Benjamin Class! This week we have really enjoyed researching facts about the inspirational Baroness Floella Benjamin and we have been writing some spectacular biographies about her fascinating life. We have discussed how she was a wonderful presenter, singer, businesswoman and champion of children's rights.

We found out about the racism and challenges she faced, particularly in her early life, and read her fantastic book 'Coming to England'. Here are some superb examples of our work!



Year 4 have made a fantastic start to the new school year! The children have been learning all about the famous mathematician Fibonacci, exploring how maths is all around us in nature and discovering his remarkable Fibonacci sequence. They worked hard to write their own biographies about his life and achievements, showing great enthusiasm and curiosity along the way.

The children have been amazing and it's been wonderful to see how much fun they've had while learning. Thank you to Year 4 for your hard work already – it's going to be an amazing year ahead! What a wonderful first week (and a bit) we are having in Gandhi Class. All the children have been throwing themselves into the work with enthusiasm and great spirit, no more so than their music class. This is the first year we have had drumming as an option at Chestnuts and even in week one they were able to produce some magical sounds - you could feel the beat reverberate through the building. We have created our Rights Charters - which highlight our responsibilities for safety, growth and em-

powerment; we have researched our class namesakes: Shirley Thompson and Emmeline Pankhurst; and started our topics - The Round City of Baghdad, Stories of the Prophets, and exploring why there is a Drought in California and what we are doing to mitigate its effects.

To start our science unit on Space and the Solar System, we independently researched our STEM Hero and British Icon: Professor Stephen Hawking. All the while linking our work to our Rights Respecting Schools Articles.

Article 2 (non-discrimination) The Convention applies to every child without discrimination, whatever their ethnicity, sex, religion, language, abilities or any other status, whatever they think or say, whatever their family background

Article 23 (children with a disability) A child with a disability has the right to live a full and decent life with dignity and, as far as possible, independence and to play an active part in the community.


