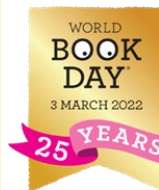
Happy Birthday

Nursery

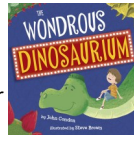
Our focus book is now 'The tiny seed' by Eric Carle. The children have been observing all of the changes outside and have drawn pictures of things they have seen on the way to nursery.

P.S I hope the dinosaurs of The Wondrous Dinosaurium are not too noisy behind your story door.



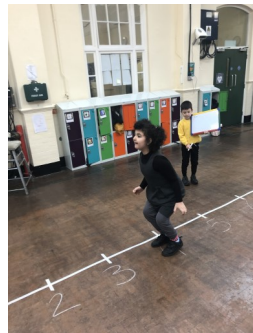
Donaldson

This week we have been looking at positional language and following and giving directions to each other. Using full sentences. We have also been trying to learn our left and right!



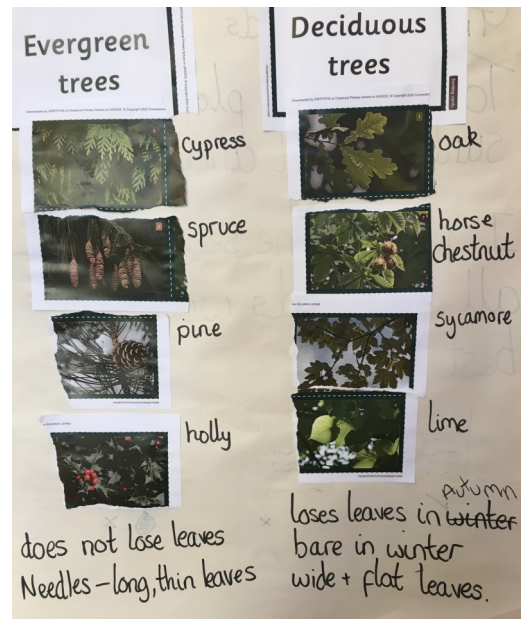
Mozart

We have been practising using a number line to subtract. Some of us even used a giant number line to jump back ourselves.



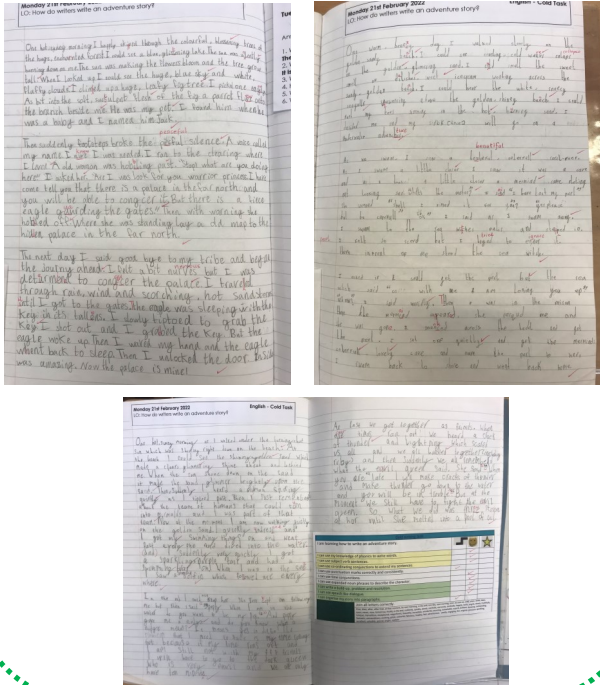
Hadid

This week we have enjoyed reading the adventure story 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers. The story has inspired us to write our own amazing adventure stories!



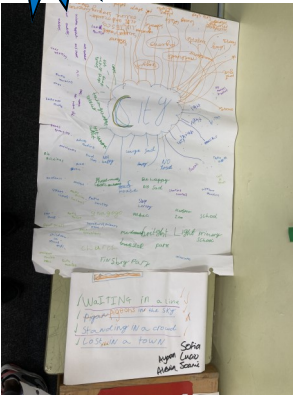
Bolt

We have been reading Oliver Jeffers' fantastic book Lost and Found. We role-played the two main characters and asked each other questions about the story.



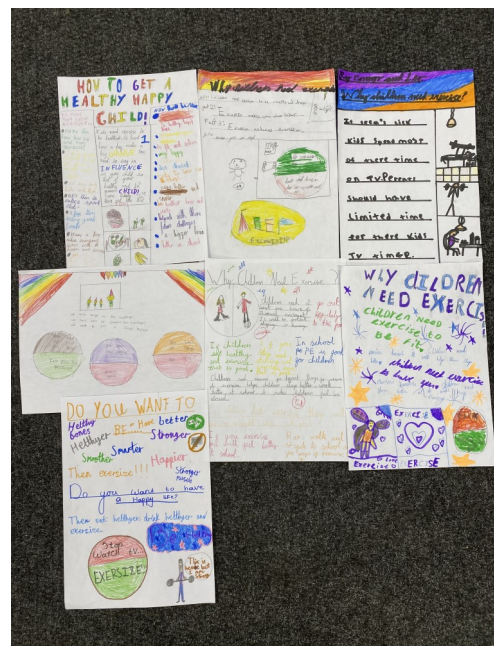
Dahl

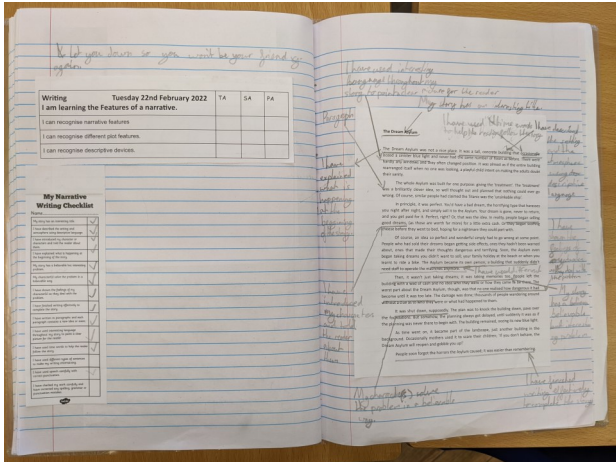
Attenborough

This week we have begun our work on narratives. On Thursday we looked at all of the features that make for a good narrative.

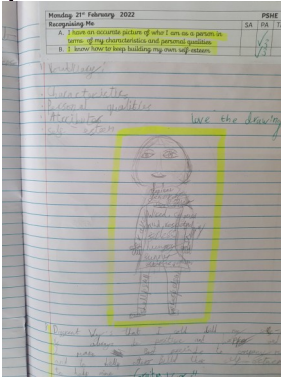


Gandhi

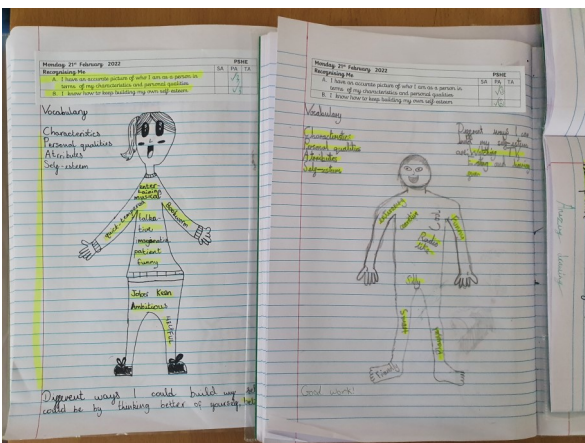

Thompson

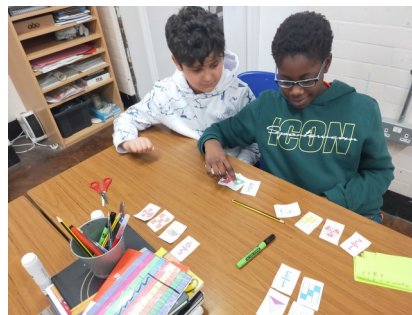

Malala

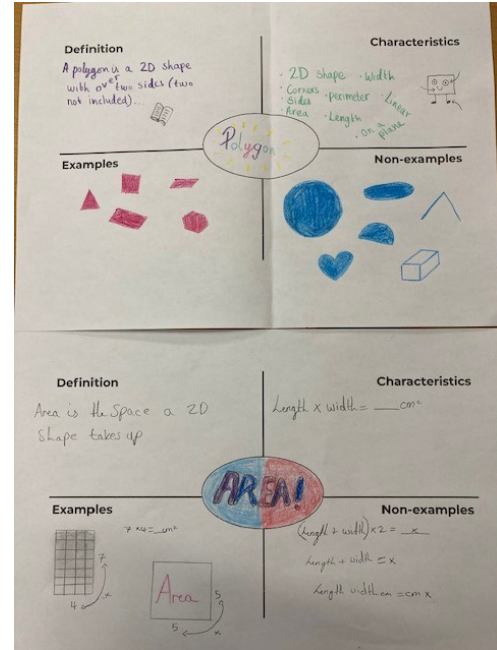

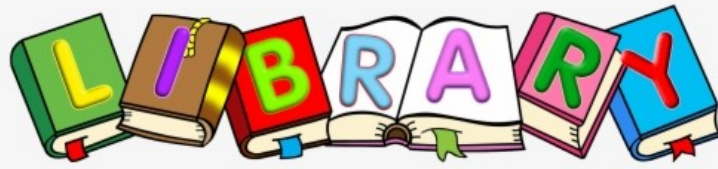


Mandela

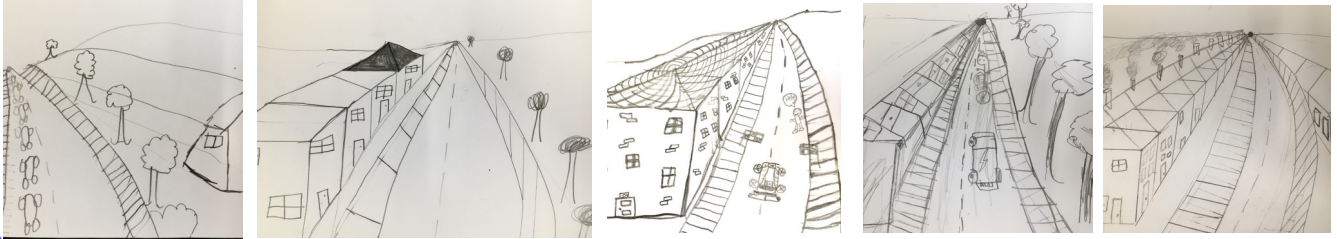

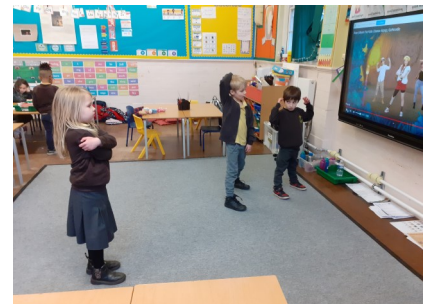

Haringey SEND Parent Carer Forum and SENDIASS are holding information sharing sessions for parents of children with SEND in mainstream schools

Come along and find out about new guidance for mainstream schools regarding meeting the needs of children with SEND, as well as learning about schools' duties and parents' rights.

The daytime and evening sessions will cover the same topics – you only need to book on to one of the sessions.

Ellika McAuley, SEND Adviser from Haringey Council will talk about the new guidance for schools:

SEND Core Standards – an online resource which sets out the expectations for the quality of provision for children with SEND in Mainstream schools

SEND Support Guide – a document for class teachers and SENDCos to use as a quick reference for identifying and effectively meeting the needs of children and young people who are receiving SEND support.

Sarah Miller and Harriet Lewis from SENDIASS will talk about parents' and children's rights in relation to mainstream education

The requirements of mainstream schools to provide SEN Support to children without an EHC Plan - what the SEND Code of Practice says

the graduated approach, and the 'assess, plan, do, review' cycle, and how parents can engage in this

the specifics of the law around parents' right to choose mainstream education, and the (limited) exceptions to this right

what steps parents can take if the legal obligations described above are not being met
